Tournament Categories:

Amateur - Open Championship

Eligibility: Open to all golfers below a handicap of 12.

Junior Category

Eligibility: Children between 12 to 18 years of age.

Note: There will be only one junior category unless an age group/category has more than 3 entries, in which case additional categories may be created as per IGU specifications followed in National Tournaments.

Mid-Amateur

Eligibility: Ages 30 to 59 years | Maximum Handicap: 18

Senior Amateur

Eligibility: Ages 60 to 79 years | Maximum Handicap: 18

Super Senior Amateur:

Eligibility: Ages +80 years. | Maximum Handicap: 18

Format of Tournament: Strokeplay (Gross) for all categories.

Scoring: Two-round totals will be added. The player with the lowest aggregate gross score over the two rounds will be the Championship Winner.

Prizes: Winner and Runner-up in each category.

Strokeplay Golf Championship Rules

General Rules

Tees: Players must start each hole by playing from within the designated teeing ground. There will be One Tee Box for all golfers (Exception Junior Category)

Fairway and Rough: Players must play the ball as it lies, without moving, bending, or breaking anything fixed or growing, except as permitted by the Rules.

Putting Green: On the green, players may mark, lift, and clean their ball, but must replace it exactly where it was. Players should repair any damage to the green caused by the ball or by a club.

Out of Bounds: If a ball goes out of bounds, players must play another ball from where the original ball was last played, with a one-stroke penalty.

Lost Ball: If a ball is lost, players must return to the spot of the previous stroke and play another ball, with a one-stroke penalty.

Unplayable Lies: Players may declare a ball unplayable at any place on the course, except in a water hazard, and proceed under the rules with a one-stroke penalty.

Based on Course Conditions Preferred Lie may be introduced at the discretion of the Tournament Committee.

Etiquette

Pace of Play: Players should play at a good pace and keep up with the group in front. Players exceeding the allotted pace of play will incur a one-stroke penalty for the first infraction. Subsequent infractions will result in a two-stroke penalty, and continued delays may lead to disqualification at the discretion of the tournament committee.



Safety: Ensure no one is in the path of the ball before making a stroke. Consideration for Other Players: Avoid distractions and maintain silence while others are playing.

Tie Breaker Rules - Playoff Sudden Death

Format: Sudden Death Playoff for 1st Position and 2nd Position

Procedure:

Playoff Holes: The playoff will commence on a predetermined hole (usually the 18th hole). If the tie is not broken after playing the first hole, players will continue to the next predetermined hole and repeat the process.

Order of Play: The order of play will be determined by a draw.

Playoff Execution: Players will continue to play the predetermined hole(s) in a suddendeath format until a winner is determined. The player with the lowest score on a playoff hole wins the playoff.

Continued Ties: If players remain tied after playing a sudden-death hole, they will proceed to the next sudden-death hole until a winner emerges.

General Playoff Rules

Same Conditions: The same rules and conditions applied during the regular rounds will be in effect during the playoff.

Etiquette and Sportsmanship: Players are expected to uphold the highest standards of etiquette and sportsmanship throughout the event. All rulings must be referred to the Tournament Committee. Any disciplinary violations will be reviewed by the Committee and may result in suspension from future events.
